Mortgage Relief Vanishes - Inflation Smashes Targets

Inflation has surged back to 3.8%, above market expectations and well outside the RBA's target band. With just 29 days until Christmas, this is devastating news for mortgage holders who can now forget any hope of rate relief. Labor's reckless spending is running at four times the rate of the economy and at its highest level outside a recession in nearly 40 years. It's keeping inflation higher for longer. Australians are paying \$50,000 every minute in interest on Labor's trillion-dollar debt while household costs have exploded: food up 15%, health up 15%, housing up 19%, insurance up 37%, and electricity up nearly 40%. Mortgage holders are paying \$1,800 more a month since Labor came to power, with 12 rate rises and only 3 cuts.
